In New York, the "hot spots" have dramatically lowered crime

Crime has significantly and continuously fallen in the "hot spots" of New York City identified by a research and study conducted by Dr. Victor Goldsmith, Associate Provost for Sponsored Research and Economic Development at Pace University.

His research shows how state-of-the-art geographic information systems (GIS), used to display patterns of crime to stimulate effective strategies and decision-making, are revolutionizing urban law enforcement. "Thanks to CompStat, a statistical tool, police officials have been able to access data previously store in many police stations in the city and have been able to react quickly."

Dr. Goldsmith is a crime mapping specialist who is also a co-author of "Analyzing Crime Patterns: Frontiers of Practice" (Sage Publications, Inc. , November 18, 1999)
