H2CU Student's Corner

My experience at NYU-Poly was formative, challenging and pleasant because it gave me the opportunity, first, to work directly with industries and solve problems they are facing and, second, to learn from students (and not only professors) with significative work experience and different background. For instance, a brief list of cases my colleagues and I solved (engaging directly with companies) includes both analyses and final recommendations on the: 1) production cost for a company producing electric motorcycles; 2) production process for a company realizing prefabricated buildings; 3) supply chain for a company producing low cost pedometers. Moreover, the collaboration with students from NYU-Stern and NYU-Tisch, in a competition sponsored by Microsoft, is an example of a highly formative extracurricular activity where only the four of us realized a new concept product with its basic code, user experience and business plan in just two months. Finally, there is no doubt that: the experience at NYU-Poly significantly influenced my job perspectives and, in fact, it allowed me to: 1) build an international network and meet some of my present colleagues while they were attending their MBAs in the USA; 2) improve my English and thus work on international assignments later on (i.e. 7-month project in Dubai); 3) learn how to manage multiple projects at the same time and interact with clients and colleagues of different cultures and ways of communication.
