Memorandum of Understanding H2CU and Fordham University in NY

Professor Lucio Ubertini Director of the H2CU and Stephen Freedman Provost of Fordham University have signed in February a Memorandum of Understanding to promote the visits of Faculty and graduate students to spend research periods at Fordham from the H2CU Universities and viceversa. The agreement will promote research and educational opportunities for both parties, and will promote the enrollment of students in graduate programs in both universities. Professor Franco de Vivo from University of Study of Cassino and Southern Lazio and Professor Richard Gyug from Fordham are the representatives for the agreement.

Hadrian's Villa: The Archaeology of an Imperial Court

H2CU and Columbia University are presenting for the fifth year the Advanced Program of Ancient History and Art (APAHA).

For the second year the program will take place in Hadrian's Villa in Tivoli (Rome) June 2-28, 2015.

The students will participate in a four-week excavations and learning program under the supervision of the Program Directors Prof. Francesco De Angelis and prof. Marco Maiuro from Columbia University.


Undergraduate and Graduate students can participate to the APAHA program, that will allow the students to learn archeological techniques through daily excavations, workshops, seminars, and field trips.

Hadrian's Villa

Columbia Summer Program in Italy: Archaeological Fieldwork



Academic Program

Columbia University offers a four-week summer program that provides undergraduate and graduate students with the unique opportunity to excavate and learn together at Hadrian's Villa, a UNESCO World Heritage site near Rome and the most important Roman villa. It synthesizes Roman, Greek, and Egyptian architectural and artistic traditions and has attracted scholarly attention for centuries.

Students enroll in the following course:

Hadrian's Villa: The Archaeology of an Imperial Court, 4 points.

- Professor Francesco De Angelis, Department of Art History and Archaeology, Columbia University

- Professor Marco Maiuro, Department of History, Columbia University

Coursework includes daily excavations, workshops, seminars, and on-site presentations. Central to the course is the combination of fieldwork with the formulation of new historical questions and scholarly approaches. The project is intended both to promote familiarity with advanced archaeological techniques and to suggest avenues about how to employ technical knowledge to think critically about the importance of Hadrian's Villa in the ancient world.

Activities

Students participate in trips to Rome and nearby areas to help situate Hadrian's Villa within the broader context of the residential culture of Roman emperors, and to appreciate its impact on Renaissance architecture.

Housing

Students live in a hotel near the excavation site. Meals are provided during the week.
